Gila Bend is a small town in southwestern Arizona known as the "Crossroads of the Southwest". With a population of under 2,000, it has long been a transportation hub and is now an emerging leader in renewable energy. Located where the Gila River makes a prominent bend, the town is rich with Native American and pioneer history.

History and heritage

- A historical resting place: For centuries, Gila Bend has been a stopping point for travelers. Its earliest inhabitants were the Hohokam people, followed by the Pima and Maricopa tribes, who used the Gila River's water for farming.
- The Butterfield Overland Mail: In the 1850s, the Gila Ranch station was a stop on the Butterfield Overland Mail route to California. It was later rebuilt after being burned down by Apache raiders.
- The railroad's arrival: The town's location was moved in 1879 to align with the new railroad line, cementing its role as a transportation hub.



Economy

- Strategic location: Situated at the intersection of Interstate 8 and State Route 85, Gila Bend is a major
 junction for freight traffic between San Diego, Mexico, and the Phoenix metropolitan area.
- Renewable energy leader: The town is becoming known as the "solar capital of the nation". It is home to
 the Solana Generating Station, a large 280-megawatt concentrated solar power plant that began
 providing energy to Arizona Public Service in 2013.
- Agriculture: Local industries include agribusiness, with several dairies and over 90,000 acres of cultivated land for crops like alfalfa and cotton.
- Other key industries: The town also hosts a natural gas power plant, a paper mill, and a Calgon Carbon facility.

Tourism and attractions

- Painted Rock Petroglyph Site: Visitors can explore ancient rock carvings left by Native American
 peoples at this significant archaeological site northwest of town.
- Sonoran Desert National Monument: Gila Bend is a gateway to this 487,000-acre desert landscape that includes three wilderness areas and historic trails.
- Gila Bend Museum: Artifacts relating to the area's rich and varied history are on display at this 12,000-square-foot museum.
- Space Age Lodge: A must-see for fans of roadside attractions, this motel features quirky "Space Age" themed architecture.
- 9/11 Memorial Park: This park is home to a 4,000-lb steel beam from the World Trade Center, displayed alongside a reflecting pool.
